Subject:	Update on BDD Operations for the Month of August 2016

ITEM:

- 1. This memorandum is to update the Buckman Direct Diversion (BDD) Board on BDD operations during the month of August 2016. The BDD diversions and deliveries have averaged, in Million Gallons Daily (MGD) as follows:
 - a. Raw water diversions: 3.39 MGD Average
 - b. Finished Drinking water deliveries through Booster Station 4A: 1.17 MGD Average
 - c. Finished Drinking water deliveries through Booster Station 5A: 1.26 MGD Average
 - d. Raw water delivery to Las Campanas at BS2A: 24.90 MG Total.
 - e. 2016 Raw water diversions year to date: 1,114.97 MG Total 2015 Raw water diversions for the same time period: 908.41 MG Total
- 2. The BDD is providing approximately 11.5 percent of the water supply to the City and County for the month.
- 3. Please see the following pages from the Monthly report to the Office of the State Engineer (OSE) for accurate information up to August 15, 2016.
- 4. Please note all prior years are also included for reference.
- 5. The current Drought Update Summary and Reservoir Storage Status are attached.



Drought, Monsoon/El Nino, and ESA Update

NOAA has recently (8-15-16) updated ENSO (El Nino) status to: neutral conditions are now present with slightly favored likelihood for La Nina conditions (hot/drv) to develop by August - October, with about a 55%-60% chance of La Nina during fall and winter 2016/17. The dynamic model average indicates La Nina by August, while the statistical models predict a transition to La Nina by fall. Dry conditions in 2016/17 could present significant challenges to all water purveyors, water utilities, and irrigators if there is not significant filling and carry-over storage in regional reservoirs from the current run-off season and/or monsoon rains. Regional reservoir levels on the upper Santa Fe, Rio Grande, and Chama Rivers are still low but rising due to warmer temperatures and resultant snowmelt runoff. Preliminary estimates are for an approximate 95%-100% delivery of full firm-yield of San Juan-Chama Project water. There are no water-related Endangered Species Act (ESA) updates. Updates on ESA issues will be made as needed. Rio Grande Compact Article VII storage restrictions went back into effect 4/22/16, which means the City will not be allowed to impound "native" runoff into Nichols and McClure Reservoirs above the pre-Compact pool of 1,061 AF (unless an exchange for water is made with the NMISC). Updates to this condition will be made as needed.

Subject:	Request approval for Amendment #1 to the contract with Alpha Southwest to build and install four (4) additional raw water pumps for pump stations 1A and 2A for an amount of \$466,000.00 plus NMGRT in the amount of \$38,736.25 for a total amount of \$504,736.25.

Issue and Item

The Buckman Direct Diversion (BDD) staff requests approval for Amendment #1 to the contract with Alpha Southwest to construct and install four (4) additional raw water pumps for pump stations 1A and 2A for an amount of \$466,000.00 plus NMGRT in the amount of \$38,736.25 for a total amount of \$504,736.25.

Background

The BDD Booster stations 1A and 2A each have four pumps. Due to the heavy sediment load in the raw water, these pumps have required numerous repairs. Four of the pumps can no longer be effectively repaired. The remaining four pumps while still in service, will also reach the point where they cannot be effectively repaired. In July, 2016, the BDD requested bids to replace four pumps (two at each pump station). At the August 4, 2016 Board meeting, the BDDB authorized \$504,736.25 from the Major Repair and Replacement fund to purchase four new raw water pumps from Alpha Southwest. The contract specifies that the pumps will be constructed and installed within 240 days so potentially, the installation of the new pumps may not occur until May, 2017.

The Raw Water Pumps bid also addressed "Alternative Bid Items" which included up to 4 additional pumps to be purchased by the BDDB within 1 year. The Alternative Bid was included to provide options to the BDD that should competitive and competent bids be received, the BDD could move forward with purchasing the needed additional pumps. The engineer's (Deere and



Ault) estimate for four pumps was \$500,000 and the successful bid was less than 1% more than this amount. The engineer also approved the pump equipment proposed by Alpha Southwest. The Alternative Bid price per pump was \$122,800.00 plus NMGRT of \$10,207.75 for a total of \$133,007.75 each. This amount is higher than the base bid because it includes a premium to hold the pricing of \$6,823.69 per pump for 1 year. Alpha Southwest has been contacted and has agreed to provide the additional 4 pumps for the base bid amount of \$504,736.25 if the BDDB elects to move forward with the purchase of the additional four pumps at the September Board meeting.

The BDD at full capacity operates with up to 3 booster pumps (at each station) online at one time with one in reserve. These pumps not only provide raw water to the BDD Regional Water Treatment Plant but also, to the sediment return system and to Las Campanas.

Recommended Action

The BDD staff requests approval for Amendment #1 to the contract with Alpha Southwest to construct and install four (4) additional raw water pumps for pump stations 1A and 2A for an amount of \$466,000.00 plus NMGRT in the amount of \$38,736.25 for a total of \$504,736.25 and approval authorizing \$504,736.25 from the Major Repair and Replacement Fund to fund the total contract price.

BUCKMAN DIRECT DIVERSION BOARD AMENDMENT No. 1 TO THE AGREEMENT WITH ALPHA SOUTHWEST, INC.

This AMENDMENT No. 1 (the "Amendment") to the Agreement between Owner and Contractor dated August 4, 2016, (the "Agreement"), is made between the Buckman Direct Diversion Board (the "BDDB") and Alpha Southwest, Inc. ("Contractor"). The effective date of this Amendment shall be the date it is executed by the BDDB.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Agreement, Contractor agreed to provide professional services to the BDDB to remove, construct and install four (4) raw water pumps for the Buckman Direct Diversion's Booster Pump Stations 1A and 2A, pursuant to Bid No. 16/38/B for the BDD Raw Water Pump Project ("the Bid");

WHEREAS, the Bid contained Alternative Bid Items which included up to four (4) additional pumps that could be purchased by the BDDB within one year of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, the BDDB wishes to purchase the four (4) additional pumps as provided in the Alternative Bid Items, at this time;

WHEREAS, the General Conditions of the Agreement limit the warranty to be provided after final completion of the Project (including for the Alternative Bid Items);

WHEREAS, the warranty limitation is based upon conditions currently existing at the Buckman Direct Diversion facility due to the design and construction of the facility's intake structure; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 10.22 of the Agreement, and for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged by the parties, the BDDB and Contractor agree as follows:

1. The Work

Article 2, The Work, paragraph 2.2 of the Agreement is amended, so that Article 2,

paragraph 2.2 reads in its entirety as follows:

2.2 The Work is located at Buckman Direct Diversion's Booster Pump Stations 1A and 2A, which are located approximately 17 miles northwest of Santa Fe, New Mexico.

The Work includes:

- a. Removing eight (total) existing vertical turbine pumps from two existing pump stations.
- b. Removing eight (total) electric motors from two existing pump stations and shipping those motors to a motor testing and repair facility. Those motors shall be returned to the Buckman Direct Diversion (BDD) and re-installed after service and testing.
- c. Manufacture, installation, startup and testing of eight (total) new vertical turbine pumps and all appurtenant equipment.
- d. All electrical and controls wiring and testing to make the new pumps completely operable with the existing system.
- e. It is understood that all mechanical, electrical and controls work will be performed by Contractor. It is also understood that BDD staff are familiar with the existing plant control systems and will assist Contractor with software programming changes necessary to make the system fully functional.
- f. The Work also consists of but is not limited to furnishing all equipment, labor and materials as required by the Owner.

2. <u>Contract Sum</u>

Article 4, Contract Sum, of the Agreement is amended so that Article 4, paragraph

4.1 reads in its entirety as follows:

4.1 The Owner shall pay Contractor in current funds for the performance of the Work, subject to additions and deductions by Change Order as provided in the Contract Documents, the Contract Sum of One Million Nine Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-two and .50/100 Dollars (\$ 1,009,472.50).

The Contract Sum is determined as follows:

3. AGREEMENT IN FULL FORCE.

Except as specifically provided in this Amendment, the Agreement remains, and shall remain, in full force and effect, in accordance with its terms.
